Title 92, Series 1, "West Virginia Parole Board, Eligibility, Decisions, and Discharges"

**Description:** These rules establish procedures and criteria to be employed by the West Virginia Parole Board when considering eligible inmates incarcerated by the West Virginia Division of Corrections and Rehabilitation for parole; in granting or denying parole; establishing conditions therefore; and providing a process for reconsideration and extraordinary remedies. Authority: W. Va. Code § 62-12-13.

**Date of First Promulgation:** 5/21/1970

**Subsequent Modifications:** 8/1/71; 11/1/83; 8/23/01; 5/1/05; 7/15/06; 3/22/10; 1/1/11; 10/15/12; 10/7/14

Title 92, Series 2, "Procedural Rules of the West Virginia Parole Board – Sanction, Rescission and Revocation"

**Description:** These rules establish procedures and criteria to be employed by the West Virginia Parole Board when sanctioning parolees; revoking the parole of those inmates who violate the conditions of parole; requesting reconsideration of decisions of the Parole Board and in discharging the sentence of those who successfully completed the conditions of parole. Authority: W. Va. Code § 62-12-13.

**Date of First Promulgation:** 10/7/2014

**Subsequent Modifications:** N/A

**RECOMMENDATION:** No Changes

**Reasons for Recommendation:** There will be future modifications; which should be expected and prepared for the 2020 WV Legislative Session.
